IV. Write a brief essay in answer to TWO of the following questions. Please write in complete sentences and make specific references to the texts as you present your argument. (20 points each).

- In both Gilgamesh's and Dante's text, we are given an image of life after death. What image is offered in each text? Are they different in any important ways? Do you think that the view of what happens when humans die affects the way characters behave and your own impression of the two texts? If so, how and why?
- 2. Shahrazad and Medea are each faced with a tyrant who treats his kingdom and his family very badly. They make very different choices about how they will respond to their husband's behavior. Describe briefly the situation of each woman and assess how successful her technique is in resolving the crisis.
- 3. Chuang Chou and Kalidasa both create texts in which things are not quite what they appear to be. In both, characters become confused and cannot understand the world around them. Briefly describe what causes the confusion in each text. Then assess whether the authors propose to the reader a way of avoiding painful mistakes and misunderstandings.
